

To Contest the Grand Jury Appearance

If your client gets a subpoena to appear in front of a Grand Jury, consider filing a motion to Quash the Subpoena.

IF YOUR CLIENT IS FORCED TO APPEAR, CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING;

RECOMMENDED RESPONSES FOR A CLIENT TESTIFYING BEFORE A GRAND JURY

"I have not had an opportunity to secure counsel and therefore request a reasonable delay so that I might exercise my right to legal advice and representation."

"I respectfully request that I be allowed to confer with my attorney prior to answering that question so that I can be advised of my constitutional rights in regards to that question."

"I respectfully decline to answer the question on the advice of my attorney on the grounds that my answer may tend to incriminate me and to answer that question would violate my rights under the First, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, and Ninth Amendments to the Constitution."
